Join a group of Stanford alumni for one of Washington's favorite summertime traditions—FREE Shakespeare performed outdoors at the Carter Barron Amphitheater. The Shakespeare Theater this year is presenting a "light, bright updating" of one of the Bard's much-loved comedies, featuring the hilarious character Falstaff and setting the play in a bawdy romp at a 1950s mountain resort.

We've reserved 30 tickets, which will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Because the tickets will not be available until the day of the event, we cannot send you the tickets in advance.

Charles will be standing near the box office between 6:30 P.M. and 7:20 P.M. wearing lots of Stanford clothing to hand out tickets to those who have contacted him. The gates to the Amphitheater open at 7 P.M., and the performance starts at 7:30 P.M. Meet Charles near the box office at 7 P.M. sharp to enter as a group and find seating together. We'll make an effort to help latecomers join the others but can make no guarantee as the theater holds 3,000 and is open seating.

The Carter Barron has a number of picnic tables near the parking lot and several areas of lawn. You may want to arrive early and bring dinner and a blanket to enjoy a picnic before meeting the rest of the Stanford group at 7 P.M. to find seats.

The Carter Barron Amphitheater is located at 16th Street and Colorado Avenue, N.W. The entrance to the free parking lot (which fills up fast!) is off of Colorado Avenue. The Amphitheater is also accessible by the S2 and S4 Metro buses.
